Short biography: Dr Ivan Nastasijević is a Senior Food Safety Scientist with more than 25 years of diversified experience in applied research, university teaching and meat industry extension. Dr Nastasijević's professional work encompasses Longitudinally Integrated Safety Assurance (LISA) system (farm-to-fork), food safety management system (HACCP), meat inspection, control of zoonotic food (meat) borne pathogens, microbial risk assessment, risk management and risk communication. Dr Nastasijević was engaged in laboratory settings (Institute for Meat Hygiene and Technology, Serbia and US Meat Animal Research Center "Roman L. Hruska"→), managed international food safety capacity building programmes (WHO) and Federation of Veterinarians of Europe (FVE), including teaching at university (Metropolitan University, Denmark; University of Central Lancashire, UK; University of Parma, Italy).

Dr Nastasijević's current research interest is related to development of reliable tools (biosensors) to support risk-based meat inspection based on Harmonized Epidemiological Indicators (HEIs) and Food Chain Information (FCI) within integrated meat safety assurance system.
